## Working Agreement between the Greater Christchurch Partnership and One Voice Te Reo Kotahi

This agreement was adopted at the 6 October 2017 GCP Committee meeting.

The *Greater Christchurch Partnership* (GCP) comprises the key local authorities, iwi authority, health board, government departments and other public sector agencies operating across Greater Christchurch.

It works to create the strategic framework necessary to ensure ongoing alignment and integration of partner activity towards the achievement of a shared vision for Greater Christchurch (see attached).

The Partnership is overseen by a formal joint committee and is supported by meetings of partner Chief Executives and senior managers and a dedicated Partnership Manager.

One Voice Te Reo Kotahi (OVTRK) is a network of Third Sector Organisations (TSOs) that support a common aim (encapsulated in the OVTRK kaupapa – see attached).

Organisations that are part of the OVTRK network put themselves on the OVTRK Register to declare their interest in working with others across greater Christchurch according to this kaupapa. The organisations may be formed around a common interest, identity, issue or place.

An OVTRK organising group meets monthly to coordinate:

- gathering information relating to TSOs
- sharing information via a OVTRK blogspot and email updates to TSOs on the OVTRK register
- organising for a relevant to the aims of the network
- liaising with local, regional and central government about strategy and policy.

## The Greater Christchurch Partnership:

- acknowledges the critical role TSOs play in supporting the economic, social, cultural and environmental wellbeing of greater Christchurch
- recognises the role OVTRK can play in providing a conduit for meaningful conversations with TSOs in developing and implementing strategy and policy
- will, through the Partnership Manager, ensure that OVTRK is well-connected to the collaborative work of the Partnership to foster such dialogue in a timely manner
- encourages individual partner organisations to consider adopting similar arrangements with OVTRK to support collaboration with TSOs

## One Voice Te Reo Kotahi:

- · understands the statutory roles, functions and requirements of the constituent partners
- acknowledges the voluntary and strategic nature of the Partnership
- will, in liaison with the Partnership Manager, use OVTRK communications and fora to assist the Partnership in engaging with TSOs in developing and implementing its strategic work
- will explore opportunities for working on matters more appropriately advanced by working directly with each partner organisation

Greater Christchurch Partnership vision (as outlined in the Urban Development Strategy)
